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POPPY AWARDS

The Poppy Award certificates are listed below. Be sure to pay close attention to each requirement. Reports received that do not meet the criteria will be eliminated.

ELLIE BUELL- NADOW, PDP AWARD

To be awarded to the Unit with the best all-around Poppy Program emphasizing the Poppy Program conducted by the Unit based on the annual and supplemental reports. The supplemental report must be typewritten, in narrative form and may include newspaper clippings and pictures. This report must include the Unit name and number, Unit president name and the name of the Unit Poppy Chairman if applicable.

JEWEL BABB POPPY AWARD

Awarded to the Unit which reports the highest gross proceeds in comparison to the number of poppies distributed.

POPPY AWARDS BY UNIT MEMBERSHIP

This award is given to the Units according to Unit membership, reporting the best year-round Poppy Program, based on the supplemental report. All entries will be judged by the Department Poppy Chairman.

DARLENE MCLAUGHLIN POPPY AWARD

Awarded to the Unit with membership 10 to 100.

FLORENCE COMBER POPPY AWARD

Awarded to the Unit with membership of 101 to 200.

JUDY LLOYD, PDP AWARD

Awarded to the unit with membership 201 and above

NADINE MENKE MEMORIAL, POPPY DISPLAY AWARD

(In honor of her dedication to the Poppy Program)

This award is presented to the unit entering the best poppy display expressing the significance of the poppy. Only displays entered in the Department Convention will qualify. The Department Poppy Chairman will select 3 Unit members from units present at convention who do not have displays in the competition to be judged.

POPPY AWARD

To be awarded to the Unit that has raised the most amount of money for the poppy drive during the fiscal year. It does not matter the number of Unit members. This amount will be taken from the financial poppy report sent to Department by June 1. The award will be handed out each year at convention.

POPPY POSTER GUIDELINES

Units shall sponsor contests in local schools. When schools do not conduct activities, other youth groups, including Junior members, may participate under direct supervision of the unit.

The Contest shall have six classes

Class I: Grades 2 & 3

Class II: Grades 4 & 5

Class III: Grades 6 & 7

Class IV: Grades 8 & 9

Class V: Grades 10 - 12

Class VI: Students with special needs as defined below:

*Those in special education classes

*A child identified as having a disability, but not in a special education class due to lack of facilities; identification of school officials.

Each 1st place division wins \$10.00. Poster will go on to Department

Poppy Poster Requirements

Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed 10 words. The articles "a", an, and the" cannot be used.

The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count.

Each poster must include a picture of the Flanders poppy in color (4 red pedals with a center of green and black. The poppy shall have four pedals and black.

The department will determine the closing date of the unit contest.

The poster shall be 12"x18" poster board. Drawing paper will not be accepted.

The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.

Posters will be judged as follows:

50% - poster appeal (layout, message, originality)

40% - artistic ability (design and color)

10% - neatness

Watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cut outs, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils and markers are acceptable for use.

Written in ink on the back of the poster put name, address, age, and grade of contestant.

Include (Department of Oregon) on the back with class in which the entry is submitted.

The work shall be the work of one individual.

The label "In Memoriam" from a veteran made poppy may not be used. The Star of David shall also be used when the Holy Cross is used.

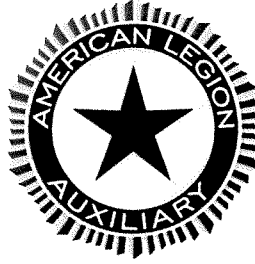

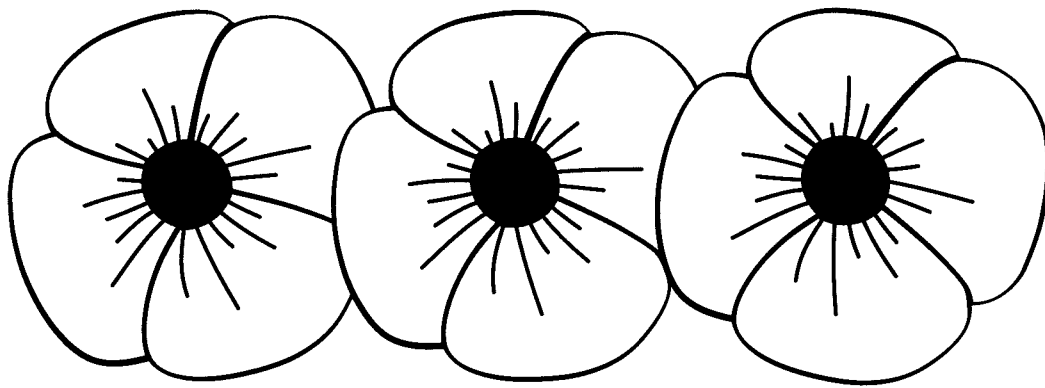

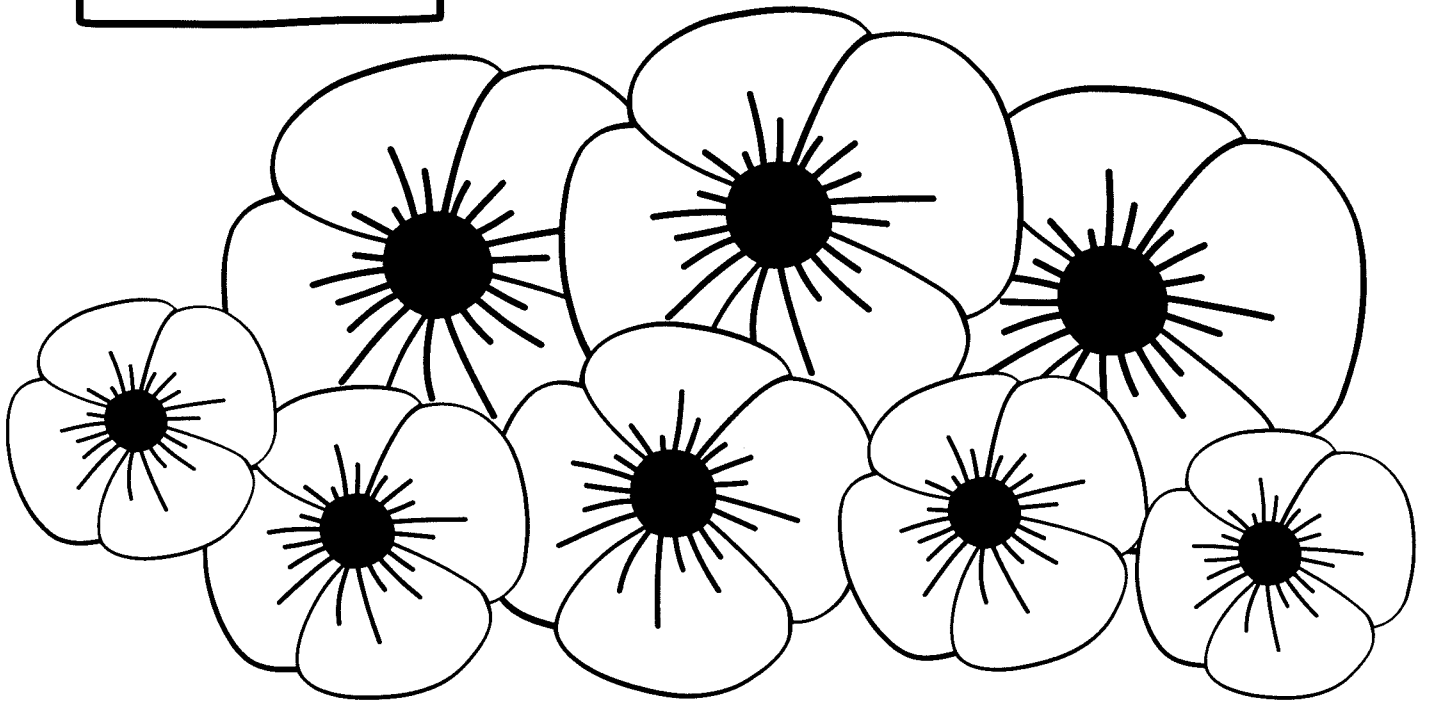
