



Since the bombing took place on February 3, 1943, many military organizations and clubs across the country observe Four Chaplains Day, and in 1998, a senate resolution was passed to recognize the 55th anniversary of the incident making Four Chaplains Day official.

### **5 FACTS ABOUT FOUR CHAPLAINS DAY**

- The U.S.A.T. Dorchester was a luxury liner. The ship was first built in 1926 as a cruise ship that would travel from Baltimore to Florida with about 230 passengers
- Boy Scouts of America. Three of the four were boy scouts. Rabbi Goode, Reverend Poling and Father Washington all served with the
- chaplains in 1948, just five years after their death, which is very rare There is a commemorative stamp. The U.S. Postal Service issued a commemorative stamp in honor of the four
