# VA BENEFITS BANKING CHANGE

By April 20, 2024, you must have a single bank account for all VA benefit payments.

Check your direct deposit information in your VA.gov profile. If you currently have more than one bank account listed for disability compensation, pension, and education benefit payments, you'll need to update your information. You must have the same account listed for all benefits.

We're making this change to help protect you from fraud and to make sure we can pay you on time, every time, without error. Change at *va.gov/change-direct-deposit/* 

### NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR DAY CELEBRATED MARCH 25

National Medal of Honor Day will be celebrated next Monday, March 25. It was established by Congress to "foster public appreciation and recognition of Medal of Honor Recipients." March 25th was chosen because it was on that date in



1863 that the first Medals of Honor were presented to six members of Andrews' Raiders. President Lincoln signed Medal of Honor legislation in 1861 and 1862. Presidents issue proclamations on that special day.

According to the Congressional Medal of Honor Society there are only 63 Medal of Honor recipients living in our nation today. They represent less than 2% of all 3,517 recipients awarded our nation's highest award for valor since the Civil War when the award was created. The last recipient living in Oregon was the late Robert D. "Bob" Maxwell of Bend.

#### DICK TOBIASON RECEIVES RECOGNITION FOR HIS SERVICE

By unanimous votes, the Oregon House and Senate have passed resolutions honoring Post 4 member Dick Tobiason for his lifetime of service to the Country and our Veterans.

Tobiason will also be inducted into the Oregon Military Hall of Fame April

28 2:30 p.m. at Camp Wythecomb, Clackamas, OR. Per the Inductees letter:

"LT. COL.(R) ALLAN R. "DICK" TOBIASON, U.S. Army Vietnam, Master Army Aviator with 20 years' service including 2 tours in Vietnam, Bronze Star, Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, 15 Air Medals with V for Valor device, and Purple Heart.

One of his proudest assignments was helping repatriate 27 American POWs in South Vietnam during "Operation Homecoming" in 1973 during his second tour.

Personally responsible for getting all 9 border to border highways across Oregon named to honor nearly one half million Oregon wartime veterans and 6,000 Gold Star Families and Medal of Honor Highway Across America on the 3,365 mile US Hwy 20 between Newport, OR and Boston, MA, and many more impressive accomplishments."

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE -VA News -WASHINGTON —(Feb. 26. 2024) Today, VA announced that all Veterans who were exposed to toxins and other hazards while serving in the military — at home or abroad — will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care beginning March 5, 2024. This means that all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11 will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for VA benefits. Additionally, Veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty in the United States will also be eligible to enroll.

This expansion of VA health care eliminates the phased-in approach called for by the PACT Act — meaning that millions of Veterans are becoming eligible for VA health care up to eight years earlier than written into law. This is a critical step forward because Veterans who are enrolled in VA health care are proven to have better outcomes than non-enrolled Vethealth erans, and VA hospitals have dramatically outperformed non-VA hospitals in overall quality ratings and patient satisfaction ratings. Additionally, VA health care is often more affordable than non-VA health care for Veterans.

VA encourages all eligible Veterans to visit VA.gov/PACT or call 1-800-MYVA411 to learn more and apply for VA health care beginning March 5. Since President Biden



signed the PACT Act into law on August 10, 2022, more than 500,000 Veterans have enrolled in VA health care.
