Be knowledgeable on flag history, etiquette and proper disposal methods.

- Publish flag etiquette tips in your newspaper and on social media.
- Educate others on how to respect the flag.
- Conduct a flag disposal ceremony.
- Host flag awareness events and communicate information
- Encourage members to fly a flag.
- Order pocket flag kits and distribute to members for assembly.
- Identify and distribute assembled pocket flags to active-duty military overseas.

Promote the observation of patriotic holidays.

- Volunteer for a local patriotic event.
- Organize a patriotic holiday event.
- Sign up to receive notifications on when to display your flag at half-staff at www.legion.org

Encourage members to vote.

- Encourage members to participate in Get Out the Vote and Kids Voting USA campaigns.
- Vote, and encourage others to vote.

Increase participation in the Americanism Essay Contest.

- Contact schools and other organizations such as the Young Marines, Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts, and 4-H about the essay contest.
- Encourage Junior members to participate in the essay contest.
- Create information packets explaining contest rules, deadline dates, theme and award opportunities.
- Work with school administration to identify guidance counselors, history teachers, etc., whose students would be interested in participating

- At least one (1) joint meeting with Legion family held in February. (Americanism month)
- Working with youth, including church groups, schools, etc.
- Narrative Report may include copies of your local current events (social media included), newspaper clippings, and other pictures relating to your project. (not required).
- Must include the Unit name, number, the name of Unit President, and name of Unit Chair.

The Americanism Chairman and selected judges will determine the winner.

R. Marie Martin Award:

- Awarded to the Unit with the most outstanding narrative report highlighting their Americanism program.
- Must include the Unit name, number, the name of Unit President, and name of Unit Chair.

Americanism National Essay Contest:

Each year, the American Legion Auxiliary sponsors an Americanism essay contest for students in grades 3-12, including students with special needs. Grade levels are divided into six classes. One award in each of the six classes will be awarded in each division.

National winners will be posted at www.ALAforVeterans.org after National convention. - Must include the Unit name and number.
